



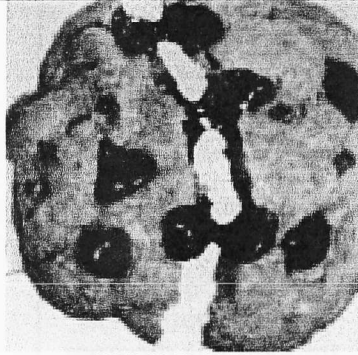

Coaches Corner:

Dribbling Drill

Using cones, form a square about 10 (adult) steps by 10(adult) steps Have each player line up on one side with their ball. On your whistle, have them dribble to the other side of the box. After everyone is across, do the same thing going back across. Make sure to have everyone stop and re-group before going back across.

Variations: You can adjust the size of your square based on the age and number of kids you have.

Have half of the player's line up on one side of the square, and half directly across from them. On your whistle, have everyone dribble across at the same time.

Divide your players evenly among all four sides of the square. Have everyone dribble across at the same time.

What this does: Teaches players to dribble in a "crowd". It forces them to look up and around them as they attempt to maintain control of the ball.

Here at 105 we strive to provide a clean, kid friendly environment for all our players and their families. That is why we have a few rules that everyone must follow while on our premises.

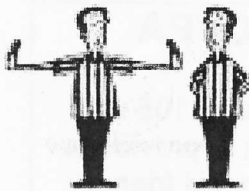
**NO SMOKING

NO PRACTICING ON THE FIELDS

If you are the first game, the nets are to be put up by BOTH coaches of the two teams that are playing on that field and taken down by BOTH coaches of the last two teams playing on that field.

Coaches when taking down the nets - be sure that all items for that particular field has been put back in the bag neatly.

All bags will contain two nets, at least on hammer and numerous net spikes that are to be divided between the two goals. The Red, Blue, Orange and Black fields will also have a step ladder that is used to reach the taller goals, these ladders as well as the bag for each field is to be returned to the brick building to be put away.

Remember to remove all net spikes from the ground with claw end of hammer. Do not pull them up using the net. This will damage the nets causing them to unravel. Thanks to everyone for their cooperation.
